Vacances	Vacation	Noun (feminine, plural)	Period of time when one is not working and is relaxing or traveling.
Valise	Suitcase	Noun (feminine)	A case used for carrying clothes and belongings when traveling.
Vase	Vase	Noun (masculine)	A container for holding flowers or decorative plants.
Vaste	Vast	Adjective	Of very great extent; expansive.
Vélo	Bicycle	Noun (masculine)	A two-wheeled vehicle that one rides by pedaling.
Vendeur	Seller	Noun (masculine)	Person who sells goods or services.
Vent	Wind	Noun (masculine)	The natural movement of air.
Verre	Glass	Noun (masculine)	A transparent material; also a container for drinking.
